DO I QUALIFY? A displaced homemaker is an individual (male or female) who has worked in the home for a substantial number of years providing unpaid household services for family members and who meets the following conditions:

Is not gainfully employed, including being unemployed or underemployed, and has difficulty in securing employment AND one of the following:

- Has been dependent on the income of another household member but is no longer supported by such income, OR
- Has been dependent on public assistance but is no longer eligible for such assistance or who may be terminated from such assistance, OR
- Is the parent of a minor child(ren) supported by public assistance or spousal support but whose children are within two years of reaching their maturity.
